Families and individuals currently receiving any one of the nine (9) New Jersey programs of financial assistance can have their pet spayed or neutered by a top professional veterinarian where they can have confidence knowing that their pet's health is a top priority. Applicants are required to provide proof of county residence and confirmation of their eligibility in one of the approved New Jersey programs. Applications can be completed and surgery appointments made at the following participating veterinary offices:
